Letter from the District Administrator

Dear Carmichael Community,

I hope this letter finds you well. There are several exciting updates and initiatives I'd like to share with you regarding our community and the ongoing efforts of the Carmichael Recreation and Park District (CRPD).

First, I'm pleased to announce the upcoming installation of a new Electronic Reader Board on Fair Oaks Blvd at Carmichael Park, expected in late March or early April. This addition, made possible through park in-lieu fees, will enhance communication and engagement within our community.

Additionally, I want to inform you about the warranty repair work scheduled for the Carmichael Park Tennis Courts. Due to a faulty coating, the courts will be closed for approximately a month. However, I want to reassure you that this repair work falls under warranty, so no district funds will be expended. Closure dates will be posted in advance on our social media accounts, website, and at the courts.

In response to valuable feedback from the public and our sponsors, we're launching a new pilot program for the Concert in the Park Series, now scheduled for late spring and early fall. This program will feature new days and times to better accommodate everyone and mitigate the effects of the summer heat. More details can be found inside this guide.

Furthermore, I'm thrilled to announce the completion of the first project funded by the Measure G Bond. The repair and recoating of Wings 200 through 600 at La Sierra were finished \$400,000 under budget, ensuring every student in the classrooms of the California Montessori Program are now protected from leaks.

We've also made significant progress in managing the \$10,000,00 Series I bond projects effectively by hiring the Cumming Group. Together, we're working on various projects, including renovating the outdated playgrounds at Glancy Oaks Park and Cardinal Oaks Park. In addition, pathways in these parks will be updated to meet ADA standards. Cardinal Oaks will also see additional lighting and a parking lot (with ARPA funding through Supervisor



Desmond's Office) added. Major projects are also planned for Carmichael Park, including the renovation of the Tiny Tot Playground near the Veteran's Memorial Hall, repaving several areas of the park, adding a new restroom near the Carmichael Park Tennis Courts, and converting two tennis courts to six pickleball courts.

CRPD staff is in the process of bids for the Phase II re-roofing for LSCC, completing all roofing work at the center this upcoming spring. Additionally, I'm pleased to report that the Bond Oversight Committee has met twice to review our bond spending, ensuring transparency and accountability.

On another note, we've updated our facility rental policies and fees, which were approved by the Advisory Board last November. For more information, please visit our website.

Lastly, as I look towards retirement this December, the CRPD Advisory Board and Sacramento County Supervisor Rich Desmond will initiate the recruitment process for a new District Administrator. Stay tuned for updates on this in the next Activity Guide.

As we continue our journey forward, I encourage you to stay connected with us through our website and social media channels. Join us on Facebook and Instagram to stay informed about upcoming events and exciting developments within our community.






